### DEFINITION OF TITLE I

 Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are low achieving or at most risk of falling behind

 The funding is meant to help students who are at risk of falling behind academically

 Schools that have 40% of students from low income families can operate as a school wide program

### SCHOOLWIDE PROGRAM

 The school uses Title I funds to upgrade the entire educational program of the school

 Title I funds are used to serve all children in order to raise academic achievement

 Title I funds will be used to provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting performances

### REQUIRED NOTIFICATIONS TO PARENTS

#### Teacher qualifications:

The district must notify parents of their "right to know," and at their request, provide the following information about their child's teachers: •

- Whether they met state license requirements for the grades and subject areas taught
- If they are teaching under emergency of provisional status
- What baccalaureate degree and other degrees that teachers have earned
- The qualifications of paraprofessionals
- Whether the child has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified

#### LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION PROGRAMS

Not later than 30 days after the beginning of the school year, the district is required to inform a child's parent or guardian of a limited English proficient child identified for participation in a Language Instruction Educational Program
